The Commissioners Court after due deliberation agrees to extend the time for the completion of the block map system of Upshur County contracted to be finished by A F Shepperd by January 1st, 1927, to the 15th day of November 1927, and the Clerk is ordered to notify the Bondmen of this order, adapted.

It is ordered by the Court that road beginning at Lawrence Penicks farm running to the Harrison County line on Simmons School House road be established as a public road without expense to the County. Width 30 feet (posted).

Ordered by the Court that in the matter of the County paying for field notes in consolidation School districts, it is the decision of this Court that the localities benefited should bear the expense rather than the County as a whole.

TO THE HONORABLE COMMISSIONERS COURT OF SAID COUNTY:

Your petitioner, Magnolia Gas Company, a corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of Delaware, having a permit to do business in the State of Texas, and with its principal Texas office at Dallas, Texas, respectfully represents that it is now engaged in the transportation of natural gas, and has the authority to construct pipe lines for transporting such gas, as well as oil and other substances, through pipe lines, and that it desires to construct such lines, together with telegraph and telephone lines to be used in connection therewith, in the County of Upshur. That in the construction of such lines it will be necessary to pass over, along and under the public highways and places in said County at certain points.

Your petitioner, therefore, prays for permission to cross and pass over, along and under and to occupy the public roads and highways of said county in the laying, construction, operation and maintenance of said pipe lines and telegraph and telephone lines, and that an order be entered by this court granting such permission, it being understood that such improvements are to be so constructed as not unnecessarily to interfere with the public use of said roads, and that it will at all times conform to the orders of this Honorable Court.

BEGINNING at the Southern S W corner of Brumley School District No. 3., which is the Eastern S E corner of the Simpsonville School District No. 2, same being the S E corner of a tract of land on the E L Rateliffe Survey owned by I Goolsby, a corner on the Southern line of said Rateliffe Survey; THENCE East with the Southline of said Brumley School District No. 3, at 3728 varas pass the S E corner of said Rateliffe Survey in the West line of a survey in the name of Freeman Prather and at 5672 varas the S E corner of said Brumley School District, No. 3, on the West bank of Lillie's Creek; THENCE down said creek with its meanderings the general course of which is Southwestward at 2115 varas pass the S W corner of Concord School District No. 10, same being at a point where the Gilmer Precinct line crosses said Creek, same being the North line of the Gilmer Precinct No. 1, and same being the N E corner of Bettie School District No. 11, and continuing down said creek with its meanderings, same being the east line of the Bettie School District and west line of the Concord School District, passing through Freeman Prather Survey, and the N E portion of the J W Cleghorn Survey, the Chas.
