PETITION TO THE COMMISSIONERS COURT OF UPSHUR COUNTY, TEXAS, FOR ROAD BOND ELECTION TO BE HELD IN ROAD DISTRICT NUMBER 3-B, OF SAID COUNTY.

TO THE HONORABLE COMMISSIONERS! COURT OF UPSHUR COUNTY, TEXAS;

WE, THE UNDERSIONED, being more than fifty (50) in number and being resident preperty taxpaying voters of ROAD DISTRICT NUMBER 3-B OF UPSHUR COUNTY, TEXAS, and who each owns taxable property in said Road District and who each has duly rendered his or her property for taxation, respectfully represents unto the Court as follows:

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That we desire this Honorable Court to order an election to be held in said Road District, for the purpose of submitting the following proposition to the qualified property taxpaying voters of said Road District, for their action thereupon, towit:

whether or not the bonds of Road District Number 3-B, of Upshur County, Texas, shall be issued in the total principal sum of One Hundred Eighty Seven Thousand Five Hundred. Dollars (\$187,500.00) for the purpose of constructing, maintaining and operating macademized, graveled or paved roads and turnpikes or in aid thereof in said District, and which bonds are to bear interest at the rate of not exceeding Four Per centum (45) per annum, and are to be payable at such times as may be deemed most expedient by the Commissioners' Court, but not to exceed Thirty (30) years from the date thereof, and whether or not ad velorem taxes shall be levied on all taxable property within said Road District for the purpose of paying the interest on the said bonds and providing a sinking fund for the redemption or payment thereof at maturity."

II.

WE FURTHER REPRESENT to the Court that if said bonds are voted and issued, the money reserved from the sale thereof will be applied to the construction and maintenance of a gravel base, asphalt surface roadway at and in the following locations in said district:

Old Big Sandy and Gilmer Highway from the South City Limits of Gilmer to the intersection of highway No. 155. From the intersection of Highway No. 155 to Mings Chapel School building. Red Rock road from Old Big Sandy Highway to Highway No. 80. From Mings Chapel to the Red Rock Road; From Ben Adams place to Red Rock Road; From Joe Johnson place to the Dunagan Road. From Red Rock road to Upshur and Gregg County Line along the old Big Sandy and Gladewater Highway. From point of intersection of the last named road along Gay Avenue of City of Gladewater to intersection of Highway No. 271. The Wost Mountain loop to the intersection of Red Rock Road. From Red Rock Road to intersection Highway No. 271 known as Gipson Road.

III.

AND WE FURTHER REPRESENT unto the Court that the proposed improvement will be for the benefit of all taxable property situated in said ROAD DISTRICT NUMBER 3-B, OF UPSHUR COUNTY, TEVAS.

WHEREFORE, we respectfully petition this Honorable Court to fix a time and place at which this petition shall be heard, which date shall not be less than fifteen (15) nor more than thirty (30) days from the date of the order setting such petition down for hearing, and proper notices thereof shall be given as required and prescribed by law, and that after such hearing, if found that such proposed improvements would be for the benefit of all taxable property situated in said Road District Number 3-B, of Unshur County, Texas, that then this Court shall make and cause to be entered of record upon its Minutes an order directing that an election be held within and for said Road District Number 3-B, at a lawful date to be fixed in such

order, for the purpose of determining the question herein mentioned, and that notice of such election sha'l be given for the length of time and in the manner required and prescribed by law, all of which is respectfully submitted.

WHEREFORE, we further pray that this Court do, upon such hearing, take such action and do such things with reference to the matters herein mentioned as it is authorized to do under the provisions and requirements of Chapter 16, of the General Laws passed by the Thirtyninth Legislature, at its First Called Session in 1926, and amendments thereto.

ON THIS the 15th day of January, 1952, the County Commissioners' Court of Upshur County, Texas, convened in Special session, at the regular meeting place of said court in the Courthouse at Gilmer, Texas, all members of the Court, towit:

H. L. Riwell, County Judge, Presiding; and
Jim Shockey, Commissioner, Precinct No. 1;
E. H. Shaw, Commissioner, Precinct No. 2;
J. B. Venn, Commissioner, Precinct No. 3;

being present; and, among other proceedings had by said Court, were the following:

There came on to be considered a petition signed by Ben D. Monk and certain other persons, alleging themselves to be resident property taxpaying voters of Road District Mumber 3-B, of Upshur County, Texas, who own taxable property in said District and who have duly rendered the same for taxation, praying this Court for an order for a hearing for a bond election to be held within said Road District Mumber 3-B, for the purpose of voting bonds in the principal sum of \$187,500.00, such bonds to be issued upon the faith and credit of said Road District number 3-B, a defined District of said County, for the purpose of constructing, maintening and operating macadamized, graveled or paved roads and turnpikes, or in aid thereof, in said district; and

WHERFAS, the said Road District Number 3-B, of Upshur County, Texas, was duly created by order of this Court duly passed and entered of record on the 30th day of November, 1951, said order providing that the said district is created and established for the purpose of the construction, maintenance and operation of macadamised, graveled or paved roads and turnpikes, or in aid thereof, under and by virtue of the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas, including Section 52 of Article 3, of the Constitution, and Chapter 16, Acts 1926, First Called Session, and amendments thereto; and,

WHEREAS, it further appearing to this Court that such petition for said bond election is signed by more than fifty (50) of the resident property taxpaying voters of said Road District Number 3-B, of Upshur County, Texas; and,

WHEREAS, the statute expressly providing that upon the presentation of a petition signed by fifty (50), or a majority, of the resident property taxpaying voters of a road district or political subdivision praying the Court to order an election for the purpose of voting bonds and the levy of taxes in payment thereof, it shall be the duty of the Court to which such petition is presented to fix a time and place at which time such petition shall be heard, which date shall be not less than fifteen (15) days, nor more than thirty (30)days, from the date of the order setting such petition down for hearing; and,

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
